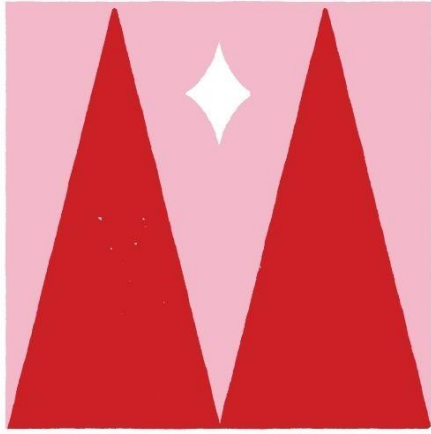
There is now a guitar club running from

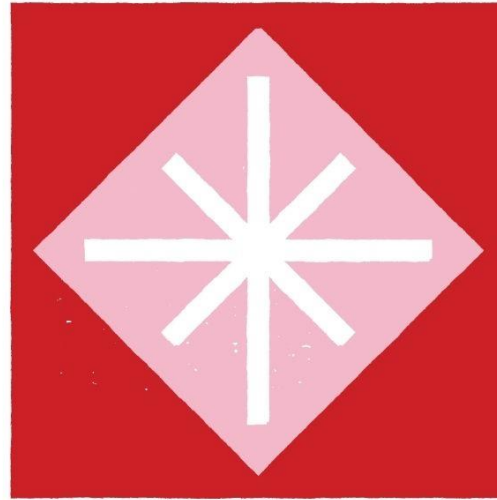

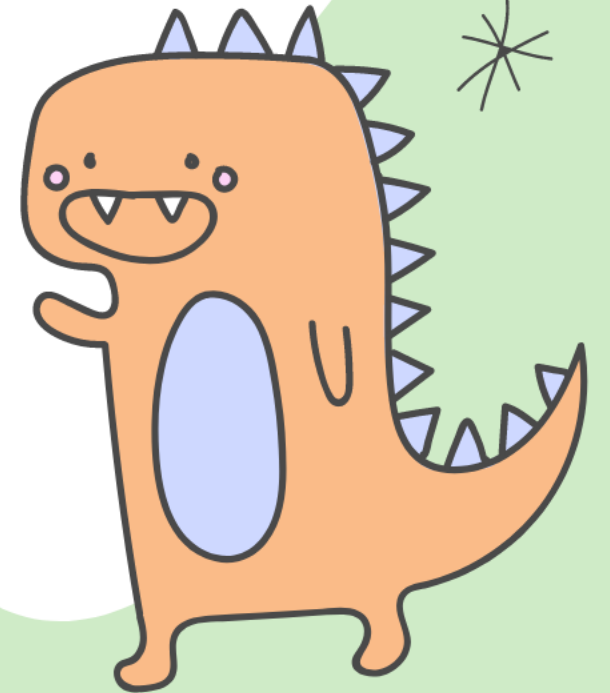
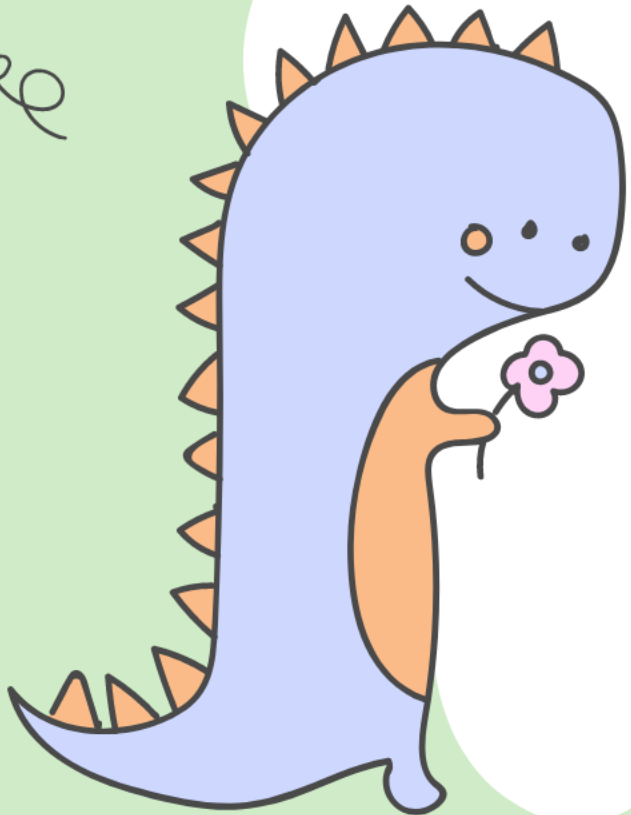
