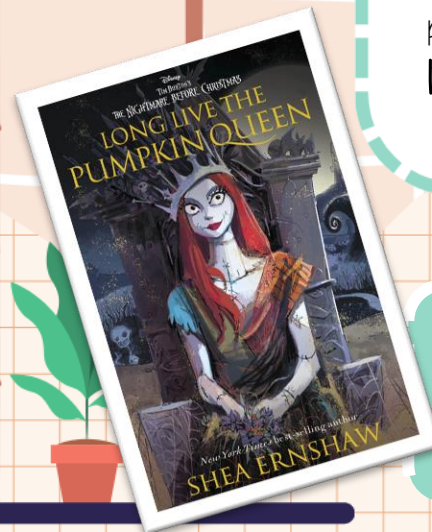
BOOK OF THE WEEK

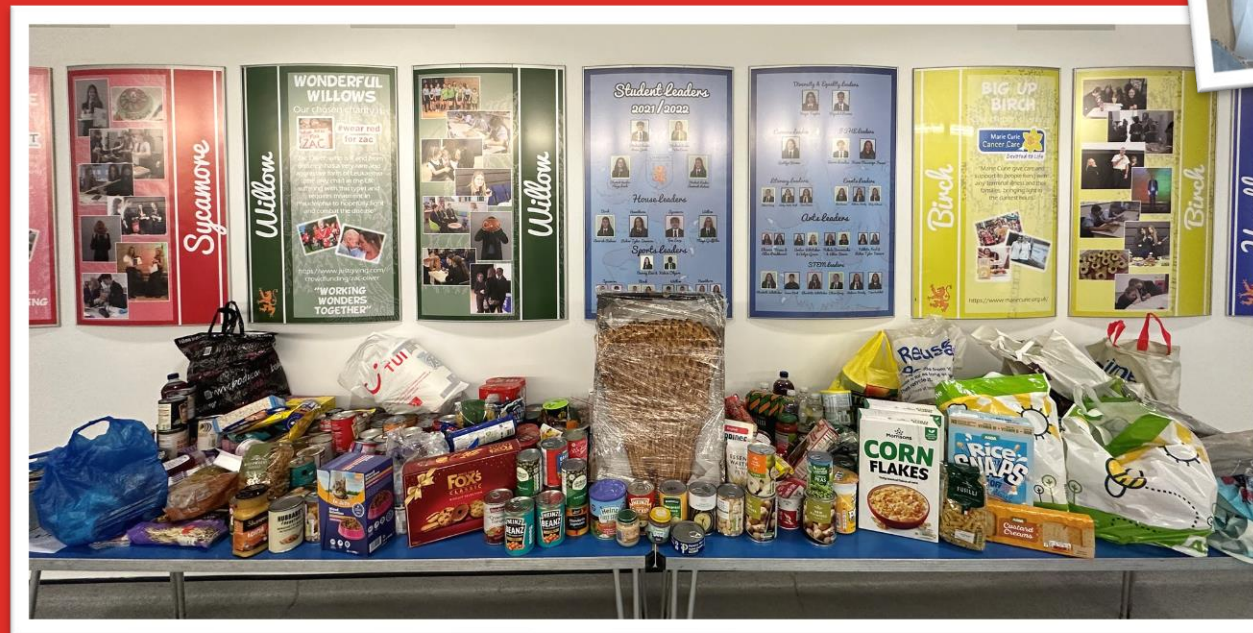

Please decorate a stone in memory of someone/pet that you have lost.

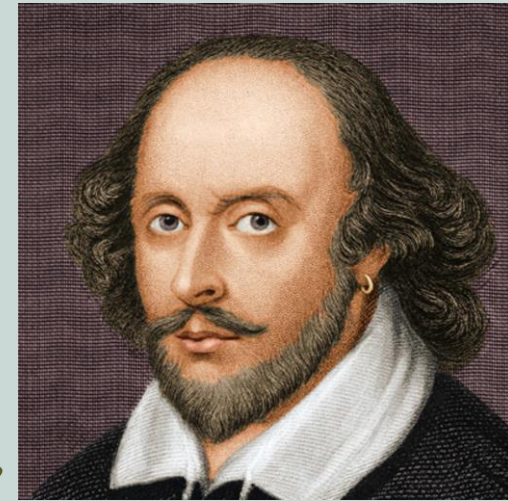
These stones will then be put together and displayed in a frame outside.
